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GENERAL GUIDELINES

- A learner only receives the highest award per activity each year (for example, if it is Full colours, Half colours are not given).
- The policy is evaluated and revised from time to time. Therefore, changes may be made during the year. A medal of honour is a special award.
- Learners than enrol from other schools can receive recognition when providing evidence of achievements that comply with this regulation.
- Sports awards are subject to learners who played 75% of matches for the season and attended 90% of the scheduled practices.
- Condition: Awards are subject to true Montie citizenship. Special awards and trophies are subject to the approval of the management committee.
- Awards for individual achievements that are not included in the regulations will be considered by the committee on merit, taking the general guidelines into account.
- All awards must be substantiated by evidence from an official body.
- The final decision regarding the awards rests with the organizers and the awards committee.

REFER TO SECTIONS A – H FOR SPECIFIC AWARDS

SECTION A: ACADEMIC AWARDS

The grade 8 to 11 academic awards are calculated according to the final promotion mark of the previous year. It is awarded in February of the following year during the Academic prize giving ceremony. Grade 12 awards are granted based on their year marks and given out during the "Excelsior" evening at the end of the year. All relevant examinations must be written before the award is granted. If the necessary exams are not written, the learner will receive the necessary award for which they qualify, but cannot be considered for the Academic Top 15.

Honour Blazer

Awarded to learners in Grades 10 – 12 who were named as one of the Academic Top 10

achievers of the previous year – provided the learner's average is 85% and above.
Awarded to learners in Grades 8 and 9 who were named as one of the Academic Top 5
achievers of the previous year – provided the learner's average is 85% and above.

Medal of Honour

- Bronze: Grade 10: Average of 90% and higher for three years
- Silver: Grade 11: Average van 80% and higher for four years
- Gold: Grade 12: Average van 80% and higher for five years

2. SUBJECT AWARDS

The best subject performance is awarded to learners who perform best in a subject with a minimum requirement of 80%. Learners receive a voucher and a certificate.

3. TOP ACHIEVERS PER GRADE

The Top 15 learners in each grade receive a Top 15 badge. The Top 15 learners are based on the final promotion marks for the previous year (Gr 8 to 11) and year marks (Gr 12).

5. TOP ACADEMIC AWARDS

Dux learner and trophy for outstanding academic achievement

- The Dux learner award is awarded to the matriculant who achieved the best academic performance. The performance is calculated based on the year mark achieved during the matric year.

SECTION B: CULTURE AWARDS

It is the responsibility of each activity leader/responsible staff member to administer and record the learners' achievements/marks on a spreadsheet. This information must be checked by the staff member concerned for the sake of a learner's merit awards. It is the activity leader's responsibility to ensure that learners' culture marks are correct each year. The staff member concerned must manage the learner's marks according to this policy.

The spreadsheet sent by the head of activities to the Head of Culture must reflect all marks. It must be clearly indicated which marks the learner has obtained for the different activities. The Head of Culture is responsible for approving awards AFTER the activity heads have finished checking and sent the spreadsheet to the Head of Culture.

Culture awards are awarded as follow:

- **Certificate of Participation**
Learner must have collected at least 500 points for the year
- **Certificate of Merit**
Learner must have collected at least 500 points plus an additional 100 points for the year
- **Half Colours**
Learner must have collected at least 1000 points for the year or obtained merit certificates for three consecutive years

- **Full colours**
Learner must have collected at least 2000 points for the year or obtained Half colours for three consecutive years
- **Honour blazer**
Learner must participate in at least two different cultural activities and collect a minimum of 3000 points for the year.
- **Medal of Honour**
Bronze: Individual or group third place (national)
Silver: Individual or group second place (national)
Gold: Individual or group first place (national)

1. PLAY COMPETITION/ ACTING

Awards will be determined according to the contribution and role of the player. Actors and technical assistance earn awards for acting. The final decision rests with the Head of Culture as well as the committee.
